Saying Something Nice is like Giving a Gift

1. Get your friend's attention. ☆ Say your friend's name or gently tap on shoulder



- 2. Say something nice...
 - ☆ "That's a nice ____(painting)."
 - ☆ "That's a cool toy."
 - **☆ "Nice job."**
 - ☆ "Nice try."
 - ☆ "I like your _
 - ☆ "Thank you."





3. Offer to your friend a **high-five**.

- 4. When you receive a compliment from another child or adult...say, "Thank you."
- 5. Parent: Offer compliments throughout the day to help your child practice saying "*Thank you.*"
- 6. Parent: Try to *set your child up* by giving him/her reasons to give you a compliment throughout the day. Start off by using the visual prompts that have been provided.







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What is a Compliment **?**

- 1. Saying something NICE **about** someone
- 2. Saying something NICE **to** someone

When you say something nice about a person, to that person, he or she will probably feel good. This is why we say, you *give* a compliment....like you are giving a gift.
